


# A585

## Windy Harbour to Skippool

November 2021



Welcome to the latest edition of the A585 Windy Harbour to Skippool project newsletter, keeping you up to date with the latest progress and information. This year has really flown by, and it's great to see our construction work progressing so well.

We'd like to say a big thank you to our team who worked extremely hard to complete work at Skippool Road, and remove the closure in advance of the six-week time frame. In addition to diverting the water main, we were able to complete other construction activities within the closure. This included installing new drainage and realigning the kerbs, which will help progress the overall programme. We'd also like to thank you for your patience during this time.

As we approach Christmas, we'll be finishing off as much work as possible before closing site for the festive period. Our sites will close from Friday 24 December, before returning on Tuesday 4 January 2022. # Scheme update

## **Lodge Lane**

We've recently started rotary bored piling to build support walls for the new bridge. Rotary bored piling is less disruptive compared to other types of piling, as holes are drilled and rotated in the ground. These are then filled with reinforced steel and concrete, which will support surrounding structures.

## **Old Mains Lane**

We've finished installing the piling, which is needed to build a stable foundation for future construction activity. Work to install new drainage and constructing the new bridge running over Main Dyke has also started. The second set of pedestrian lights near the garage have been removed, and the north footpath providing pedestrian access to Old Mains Lane has re-opened.



## Garstang Road East

We continue to transport ground material from surrounding fields to build the new bypass. The two-way traffic lights will remain in place to help construction vehicles cross the road safely.

## Garstang New Road

Peat has been removed from the field next to Garstang New Road and replaced with recycled stone to form the base of the new road towards Windy Harbour.

## Skippool junction

Following the removal of the Skippool Road closure, we're now working in the verge area heading towards Old Mains Lane and along Amounderness Way. This work includes diverting utility services, installing new drainage, and realigning the road layout.

## Return to Streetlife

Ultra-Sites status is achieved by actively seeking to improve not only their own performance but that of the wider construction industry, particularly through the supply chain. We were commended on several initiatives including site safety and environmental awareness. Adopting zero emission vehicles into our operations will also help us to reach our target of net zero by 2050.
